School Attendance Really Matters

It seems obvious to say that kids need to be in school to learn. But a study from *Time* shows just how important it is.

On state tests, kids who were in school the most did the best. The children who came to school 93% of the time outscored everyone else. Their scores were in the 85th-99th percentile on the exams. When kids missed even a few more days, their scores went down. The kids who were in school 91% of the time didn't do as well. Their scores were in the 65th to 84th percentile.

Woody Allen said, "Success is 20 percent timing, and 80 percent showing up." Teachers can't teach kids who are not in school. Make sure your child attends every day.
